

# EVERGREENS

## TOPIARIES

### Poodle Topiary

2-ball & 3-ball upright; each ball graduated in size; annual maintenance necessary to maintain shape; juniper

### Pom Pon Topiary

multiple poms; width and height varies per plant; blue and green varieties; annual maintenance necessary to maintain shape; juniper

### Spiral Topiary

pruned in deep spiral shape; annual maintenance necessary to maintain shape

## ABIES

*A. concolor*

### White Fir

(35-40') width half of height, pyramidal shape; short needled; tolerant of drought; a majestic evergreen; full sun

## CHAMAECYPARIS

*C. pisifera*

### Goldmop Cypress

(3') dwarf mounded shrub, slow growing; delicate appearance; thread-like branches have golden yellow color when planted in full sun

## JUNIPERUS<sub>spreading</sub>

*J. chinensis*

### Gold Coast Juniper

(4-6' high x 6-7' wide) green foliage; new growth is bright yellow

*J. chinensis*

### Hetzi Blue Juniper

(5-6' high x 5-6' wide) bright minty green foliage

*J. chinensis*

### Seagreen Juniper

(4-5' high x 5-6' wide) bright minty green foliage

*J. chinensis*

### Compact Pfitzer Juniper

(24" high x 5-6' wide) light grey-green foliage

*J. chinensis*

### Green Sargent Juniper

(18-24" high x 5-6' wide) bright green summer and winter

*J. horizontalis*

### Andorra Juniper

(18-24" high x 7-8' wide) also called 'Youngstown'; grey-green foliage in summer, purple in winter

*J. horizontalis*

### Bar Harbor Juniper

(10-12" high x 6-7' wide) blue-green in summer, silvery plum in winter

*J. horizontalis*

### Blue Rug Juniper

(4-6" high x 7-8' wide) light blue foliage, purple tint in winter

*J. horizontalis*

### Hughes Juniper

(15" high x 6-8' wide) silver-blue foliage, purple in winter

*J. procumbens nana*

### Procumbens Juniper

(12-15" high x 6-7' wide) blue-green foliage

*J. sabina*

### Broadmoor Juniper

(12-15" x 4-5') grey-green foliage

*J. sabina*

### Buffalo Juniper

(12-15" x 3-5') medium green

*J. sabina*

### Calgary Carpet Juniper

(6-8" high x 7-8' wide) soft green foliage

*J. squamata*

### Blue Star Juniper

(2-3' high x 3-4' wide) mounded habit; rich silver blue foliage

## JUNIPERUS upright

*J. chinensis*

'Hetzi Columnaris'

### Fairview Juniper

(15' x 5') dense and pyramidal, bright green foliage

*J. chinensis*

### Keteleeri Juniper

(15-20' x 6-7') broadly pyramidal, medium green foliage

*J. chinensis*

### Mountbatten Juniper

(8-12' x 4-6') narrow, pyramidal; bright green needles

*J. scopulorum*

### Pathfinder Juniper

(20' x 6-8') narrow, pyramidal; blue-grey foliage; excellent cold tolerance

*J. virginiana*

### Burki Juniper

(15-20' x 5') pyramidal habit; blue tinted foliage

## MICROBIOTA

*M. decussata*

### Russian Arborvitae

(12" x 3-4') also called Russian Cypress; dwarf and densely branched; graceful form; bright green color turns bronze in winter; use in full sun to full shade

## PICEA

*P. abies*

### Norway Spruce

(40-50' x 20-25') bright green color; broadly pyramidal habit; medium growth rate

*P. abies nidiformis*

### Birdsnest Spruce

(4' x 6-7') distinctive plant for accent use; slow growing, flat topped; stiffly branched; use in full sun

*P. glauca 'Conica'*

### Dwarf Alberta Spruce

(6-7') slow growing dwarf, very short needles; pruning necessary only for shaping

*P. glauca 'Densata'*

### Black Hills Spruce

(20-25' x 10-12') bright green needles mature to blue-green in color; dense symmetrical cone shape; full sun and slow growing

*P. pungens*

### Colorado Spruce

(50-60' x 20-30') ranges of green to blue-green in color; pyramidal in habit; needs moist, well drained soil

*P. pungens glauca*

### Colorado Blue

### Spruce

(50-60' x 20-30') cultivated for color; bright silvery blue needles; pyramidal habit

## PICEA continued

*P. pungens glauca*

### Fat Albert Spruce

(30' x 15') aptly named spruce; dense needles extremely silver-blue

*P. pungens glauca*

### Hoopsi Spruce

(50' x 20') dense, spreading pyramidal form with intense silver blue needles; considered one of the best

*P. pungens glauca 'Globosa'*

### Globe Blue Spruce

A beautiful, rounded evergreen of intense blue color; grown as low specimen or tree form on standard. Both forms are sold at the same price.

## PINUS

*P. mugho mughus ENCI strain*

### Mugho Pine

(3-6') compact, very round plant; medium growth rate; uniform and easily maintained; best in full sun, light shade acceptable

*P. nigra*

### Austrian Pine

(55-60' x 20-40') broadly pyramidal; stiff horizontal branching; long needles, vigorous and dense; a substantial element in the landscape

*P. strobus*

### White Pine

(50-70') long bright green needles on pliant branches; softer and more graceful than other pines; fast growing; excellent decorative cones

## PSEUDOTSUGA

*P. menziesii*

### Douglas Fir

(70-90' x 30') dark bluish-green foliage, short needled; stately pyramidal habit; grows rapidly; prefers relatively dry locations

## TAXUS

*T. cuspidata*

### Capitata Yew

(25-35') rich, dark green foliage is short and pliant; slow growing; pyramidal habit; shears well; sun or semi-shade acceptable; popular for specimen use, hedging and screening

*T. media*

### Browni Yew

(4-5') globe form with medium green foliage; shapely and compact, shears well; use in sun or semi-shade

*T. media*

### Densiformis Yew

(4-6') wide spreading; dense medium green foliage; shears well; sun or semi-shade

*T. media*

### Everlow Yew

(3') low-growing and wide spreading; bright glossy green foliage; sun or semi-shade

*T. media*

### Hicksi Yew

(10-12') upright columnar; dark green foliage, often producing bright red berries in small quantities; very adaptable for hedging; sun or semi-shade

*T. media*

### Tauntoni Yew

(3') slow growing, spreading; light green foliage; extremely hardy; use in sun or semi-shade

*T. media*

### Wardi Yew

(3-4') lower form and slower growing than other spreading varieties; arching branches have short stiff needles; sun or semi-shade

## THUJA

*T. occidentalis*

### Emerald Green

#### Arborvitae

(15-20') upright columnar form; dense bright green foliage in all seasons; medium growth rate

*T. occidentalis*

### Nigra Arborvitae

(20-25') darkest green color holding well through winter; upright columnar form

*T. occidentalis*

### Techny Arborvitae

(15-20') also called 'Mission'; upright columnar form, dark blue-green foliage in all seasons; slow to medium growth

*T. occidentalis*

### Hetz Midget

#### Arborvitae

(2' x 2-3') globe form; green; very slow growing; retains globe form

*T. occidentalis*

### Woodward Arborvitae

(4-5') globe; dense habit; retains wide rounded form; medium green foliage; sun to part shade

## TSUGA

*T. canadensis*

### Canadian Hemlock

(30-40' x 15-25') pyramidal habit; dark green drooping branches; full sun to shade
